Guidelines for Offline School Celebrations Acharya Varasatvam – Rishi Parampara Day

 Date of Celebration: 28 December 2025

1. Objective

To inspire curiosity, creativity, and cultural understanding among students through engaging offline activities aligned with Rishi Parampara, Ancient Sciences, and Indian Knowledge Systems.

2. Suggested Offline Activities

Schools may organize any combination of the following theme-aligned activities:

- Photo Display / Exhibition
- Fancy Dress (Great Rishi Parampara)
 - Essay Writing
 - Elocution / Spoken Word
 - Mono Acts / Drama / Skits
- Storytelling & Symbol Interpretation
- Interactive Displays (Ancient Wisdom in Modern Life)
 - Student-led Explanations / Guided Exhibits
 - Distribution of Certificates

3. Documentation Requirements

Schools must document the celebrations through:

- Photographs
- Short video clips
- Media coverage (if available)

Each documentation set must clearly include:

- Participant Name(s)
 - Class / Grade
 - School Name
 - Activity Type
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4. Evidence Submission Process

- All documentation must be uploaded into one single Google Drive folder.
 - The Google Drive folder link must be submitted through the official Evidence Submission Google Form.
 - Folder access must be set to:
“Anyone with the link – Viewer”.
 - The Evidence Submission Google Form will be available on the official website:

 Live from: 1 January 2026
 - Last date for submission of evidence: 10 January 2026
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5. Review & Certification Timeline

- Submissions will be reviewed and verified by the organizing committee.
 - Certificates will be issued by 25 January 2026.
- Schools may distribute certificates on 26 January 2026 as part of Republic Day celebrations.



6. Final Note

Schools are encouraged to make the celebration student-led, engaging, and meaningful while staying aligned with the theme.

The decision of the organizing committee shall be final and binding.
