

ANNEXURE- III : Participant Submission Guidelines (Online Competitions)

(Applicable to both Teachers and Students)

1. Mode of Submission

- All submissions must be made only through the official Google Forms.
 - Submissions via DMs, email, WhatsApp, or any other platforms will not be accepted.
 - Only one submission per participant/team is permitted.
 - Multiple topics and/or formats may be included within this single submission, provided all work is compiled together and submitted within the deadline.
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2. Eligibility & Participation Type

- The competition is conducted separately for Teachers and Students.
 - Submissions may be made as:
 - Individual Project, or
 - Group Project with 1–3 members per team only.
 - For group submissions, one participant must submit on behalf of the team, and all team member details must be clearly mentioned.
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3. Topic Selection

- Participants may:
 - Choose topics from the provided Annexures I & II, or
 - Propose an original topic relevant to the competition theme of Ancient Sciences.
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4. Submission Formats (Any One or More)

- Poster Design
 - PowerPoint Presentation (PPT)
 - Image Collage
 - Storytelling (Audio / Video)
 - Research Paper / Essay (with supporting evidence, timelines, rishi details, statistics, etc.)
 - Ambient or ASMR Visual Video (Non-verbal)
 - Concept Film / Short Film
 - Poetry / Spoken Word
 - Infographic / Visual Explainer
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5. File & Link Guidelines

- Accepted File Formats:
 - Documents: DOC, DOCX, PDF
 - Images: JPG, JPEG, PNG
 - Audio: MP3, WAV
 - Video: MP4, MOV, AVI
 - All files (text, image, audio, video) must be uploaded into one single folder in the participant's own Google Drive.
 - Only the Google Drive folder link must be submitted through the Google Form.
 - External platforms (including YouTube) are not permitted.
 - Google Drive folder access must be set to: "Anyone with the link – Viewer".
 - Restricted or inaccessible folders will lead to disqualification.
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6. File Naming Convention

All files must be named in the following format:

Category_Name(s)_School_Age/Grade_City

7. Word Limits

- Research Paper / Essay: 1200–2000 words
 - Story / Narrative / Teaching Explanation: 800–1200 words
 - PPT Supporting Text: 600–1000 words
 - Infographic Explanation: 300–500 words
 - Poetry / Written Spoken Word: Up to 300 words
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8. References & Sources

- A References section must be included at the end of the document.
 - All books, articles, websites, videos, or other materials used must be clearly acknowledged in an ethical and legal manner.
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9. Originality, Declaration & Consent

By submitting the entry, participants confirm that:

- The work is original and authentic.
 - All sources are properly acknowledged.
 - Consent is granted to use the submission for educational purposes, including online courses, digital books, and learning materials, with due credit to the creator(s).
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10. Submission Deadline, Help Desk & Final Note

- Submission Deadline: 20 January 2026
 - Late or incomplete submissions will not be considered.
 - For any queries or assistance regarding submissions or guidelines, participants may contact the Help Desk at:

 - The decision of the evaluation committee shall be final and binding.
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11. Certificates & Recognition

- All certificates will be issued in digital format only and shared by 25 January 2026.
 - Participants submitting work in multiple formats will receive separate certificates for each eligible format.
 - For team submissions, each team member will receive an individual certificate, as per details provided in the Google Form.
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12. Project Synopsis & Official Forms Availability

- All participants must complete an official competition entry for their selected topics and formats through the designated Google Forms.
 - A Project Synopsis (text format) explaining the concept, objectives, and execution plan is mandatory.
Word Limit: 300–500 words.
The synopsis must be included in the same Google Drive folder as the final project submission.
 - The Project Synopsis must be completed and finalized by 28 December, in observance of Acharya Varasatvam – Rishi Parampara Day.
